- Overcome disadvantage caused by inequalities.
- Be healthier and happier children with better mental wellbeing and self-esteem.
- Do better at school and make more progress across the curriculum.
- Develop creativity and empathy.

How does reading benefit children? | BookTrust

Fiction, non-fiction, picture books, poetry, graphic novels all have a role to play in building a reading for pleasure culture.

The audit will look at:

- the physical library stock throughout the school, including the library and the class book areas.
- how these resources are promoted to the children.
