SLS Training: Running a Secondary School Library

This course aims to give core guidance to those who have recently taken on new responsibility for the day to day running of a Secondary School Library or Learning Resource Centre.

Over 3×3 hour sessions, it will give an overview of the Librarian's entire role with links to sources of further information. Delivered one-to-one under normal circumstances and in your own school if possible, completion of the whole course will offer a good grounding for a successful school career.

The areas covered will include

- Overview of the services offered by Hampshire SLS and how to access them
- Introduction to daily Library operations and arrangements
- Making the most of Eclipse for the Librarian, students and staff
- Managing your fiction and information book collections
- The National Curriculum and supporting teachers in its delivery
- The Librarian's broader profile and role within and beyond school

Eclipse.net Training Whole day workshop HCC_CCBS_SLS_PRSK_02319CRS

This course is taught in workshop style. Delegates will determine their own objectives with guidance from two members of staff from the School Library Service. The course will enable delegates to understand the wide range of uses for this library package and how to effectively implement the functionality in a school setting. The course is suitable for new or existing users of Eclipse.net. The course will be taught using the Silverlight version of Eclipse.net.

Outcomes:

- Delegates will achieve the objectives they have set in conjunction with the trainer
- Delegates will become more effective users of the system

Outline:

At the start of the workshop, delegates will determine their own objectives. It is expected that the course will cover some of the following areas:

- Databases: resources, tutor groups, borrowers, current loans, past loans
- Reporting
- Using reviews
- Search function for librarians, school staff and pupils
- Circulate, including Multi Issue and Return
- Scheduled tasks including Hambase & Discovery online

Advanced Dot Net Reporting and Analysis Whole day workshop HCC_CCBS_SLS_PRSK_02319CRS

This one day hands-on course is intended for experienced users of JL.net Silverlight or Eclipse.net Silverlight, whether Hosted or Non-Hosted. Delegates will work either on their own school's hosted site or, in the case of a non-hosted school, on Hants SLS's demo site.

You will learn to exploit the powerful and sophisticated flexibility of Views. Views can be used to examine all aspects of your catalogue, to monitor borrowers' loan patterns, and to highlight curriculum and fiction resources to your borrowers.

The course will be taught by two members of staff from the School Library Service.

Delegates will need to know the url of their own site and have administrator rights.

Outcomes:

- Delegates will learn to create and amend personalized Views
- Delegates will learn to interrogate databases to extract desired information

Outline:

- Copy, create, amend and make default Views
- Understand Master/Item tables
- Refine Boolean searching
- Use Custom Fields
- Make Resource Views available for borrowers

Reading Cloud for Educators

Half Day course HCC_CCBS_SLS_PRSK_02318CRS

This course is aimed at practitioners who want to embed the library into the classroom by utilising existing IT devices with the schools Library Management System (Reading Cloud) to create engaging literacy lessons which are underpinned by the library. The half day session will include refreshments and will include the following:

- Creating book reviews in the classroom on Laptops, PC's or tablets as part of literacy lesson
- Creating video book reviews using tablet devices such as an iPad or iPod Touch
- Teach research skills by creating specific topic views and cataloguing other school resources, documents or websites as well as your libraries books
- Utilising the blogging facility in the Reading Cloud as part of a home work task or an interclass project to discuss a featured book
- Using the Social media functions in the Reading Cloud to teach e-safety by allowing your pupils to use the messaging functions
- A practical run through of the Reading Cloud's social media settings and tips on implementation across your school.

Annual Free Seminar for Secondary Schools How the library can support wellbeing and mental health across the school. Wednesday 30th January 2019 HCC_CCBS_SLS_PRSK_01486CRS

Charlie Waller Memorial Trust (CWMT) was established over 20 years ago following the death of a young man from suicide. The aim of the trust is to work with adults and young people so that the issues around mental well-being can be addressed and talked about. The Trust runs workshops and training sessions for young people, parents, school staff and other professionals so that everyone is aware of the issues of mental health and how to access help when needed. This seminar will be tailored to look at how librarians and teachers can work together to support their school both in promoting discussions around mental health as well as supporting young people who may need some help.

As well as the main session from the CWMT, the SLS will provide advice and recommendations on how books can be used to encourage debate around mental health as well as provide support to students who may need it.

Gemma Darby is an experienced teacher and trainer working not only with the CWMT but also the NSPCC. She delivers training in parental support, safeguarding and issues surrounding the use of social media.

Course Outcomes:

Delegates will have a better understanding of mental health and how to recognise signs of stress and mental health concerns.

Delegates will be able to go away with strategies helping schools with issues around social media and its effects on students.

eBook Rollout for Subscribing Schools

Free Half day course HCC_CCBS_SLS_SLS_02300CRS

The rolling out and embedding of eBooks and eAudio within the School Library and how the platform should be operated within the school.

The launch events are free and are aimed to provide an overview of the eBook and eAudio platform and will include the following:

- Student enrolment methods
- An overview of the management tools
- Suggestions on student launch
- Suggestions on possible use for Teaching and Learning
- Points for SLT's to consider regarding in school use
- An overview of the shop and how to build your own collection

This event will be run by Hants SLS Digital Team and James Richmond Wheelers UK Development Executive. Hampshire SLS's eBook and eAudio platform will be set up in a hub and spoke arrangement, with our central collection sitting at the hub; then schools set up as spokes. Our central hub collection will be the largest and broadest education consortium platform in the UK. Each school will be a spoke and will have access to our collection as well as being able to purchase eBooks to build their own bespoke collection.

The platform has dual use, both for 'reading for pleasure' and 'teaching and learning'.
